












## How to read a paper online on a pc

	<i>Online-annotation has limited functionality on tablets. Using a pc is recommended.</i>
	Choose exam and student/group, and click on "Read in browser". Note: The editor will open in a new browser tab.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Show content overview <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Show annotation summary	Click on the boxes to remove the two side-columns in order to facilitate reading. Add the side-columns to navigate in document or annotations.
	Scroll through the document with scroll-bar, or page selector (bottom), or activate "Show content overview", and click on the page-icons for quick overview ("thumbnail" images).
	Click on "Highlight" to highlight in yellow. Hold down mouse button and pull to select area. Right-click, and select "Delete annotation" to undo highlight.
	Click on "Sticky note" to add a comment. Click on the screen to position, write note, and complete by clicking on "-". Right-click, and select "Delete annotation" to delete sticky note.
	Click on "Free-hand sketch" to draw in the document. Hold down mouse-button and move cursor. Right-click, and select "Delete annotation" to undo.
	Click on "Save annotations" to save your work.
	Click on the box "Show annotation summary" to display column with a list of annotations. The blue text is interactive, linking to the annotated section in the document.
	Click on "Export" to save a text-file with all annotations.
	Online-annotations are copied automatically to your "Notes" on the paper in DE. Click on "Add" display them in the lower section of the pop-up window.
	Grade the paper by choosing grade from the drop-down-menu. The grade is copied automatically to DE, but is not submitted until you click on "Submit assessments".
	If there is more than one paper in an exam, you can scroll through them in the pdf-reader.
